Summary of Teaching Experience

Currently, Dr. Dunn serves as the primary instructor and program coordinator for the Leadership Studies in Agriculture (LDAG) minor. This 15-hour minor is primarily delivered asynchronously on-line. There are approximately 100 students in the minor and over 200 students have successfully completed the minor within the last five years. She has taught 2,196 students with an overall average student evaluation of 4.51 out of 5.0. She regularly teaches *Personal Leadership Education*, *Survey of Leadership Theory*, *Leading Change and Applied Ethics in Leadership* at the undergraduate level.
